

Michelangelo, at the age of fifty-nine, learned a new method of painting, upside down, and painted *The Creation of Adam* on the ceiling of the Sistine Chapel.

At age sixty-six Colonel Harland Sanders started the Kentucky Fried Chicken restaurant chain.

Golda Meir became prime minister of Israel at age 71.

Peter Roget wrote the first edition of Roget's Thesaurus at the age of 73 and kept editing future editions until the age of 90.
